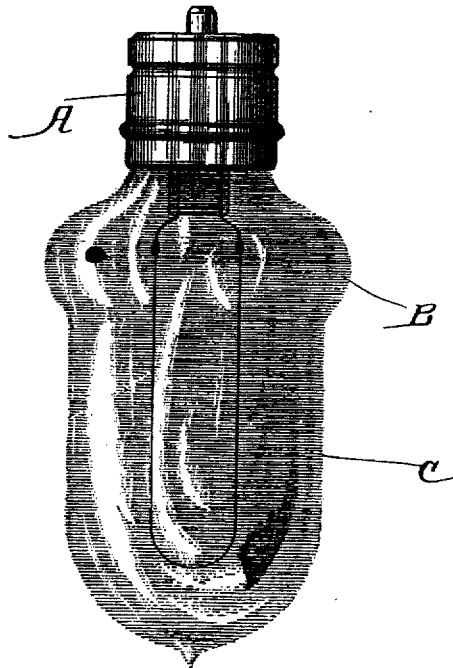

DESIGN FOR AN INCANDESCENT-LAMP GLOBE.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 20,699, dated April 28, 1891.

Application filed February 7, 1891. Serial No. 380,651. Term of patent 7 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, JOHN VON DER KAMMER, a subject of the Emperor of Germany, residing at Chicago, Illinois, have invented and
5 produced a new and original Design for Incandescent Lamps, of which the following is a specification, reference being had to the accompanying drawing, forming part thereof.

The figure illustrated is a design for an
10 incandescent-lamp globe, which is substantially in the form of an acorn, and, as will be observed, having the stem or socket A, the enlarged lower portion B, and the extending gradually diminishing portion C.

15 The design is intended to represent an

acorn, or, rather, a design somewhat in the similitude of an acorn, having an enlarged base with a forwardly-projecting cylindrical body terminating in a globular portion.

What I claim is—

The design for an incandescent-lamp globe
20 comprising the stem or socket A, enlarged curved portion B, and diminishing curved portion C, substantially as shown and described.
